

Mid America Foxtrotting Horse Association Two Year Old Futurity

Rules & Regulations

Rule # 1. All entries must be owned by a Mid America member. Membership fees of \$15.00 - Individual or \$25.00 - family, payable to the association at the time of nomination or before. No entry will be accepted without current membership.

Rule # 2. Entries must be received or postmarked by November 1 (previous to year showing), or be subject to late penalties in rule #3.

Rule # 3. The entry fee will be \$200 paid as follows: \$ 50.00 with the nomination on or before November 1st. Remaining \$150.00 due to association on or before February 1st. If the full amount of the entry fee is paid at the time of nomination, a discount of 20% (\$40.00) will be taken and the entry fee will be \$160.00. The entry shall be nominated and paid in full on or before November 1 to take advantage of the discount.

In the event the February 1 payment is late, a late fee equal to \$100.00 will be charged in addition to the required payment of \$150.00 due on February 1st. (\$250 total for a late February payment) Nominations must be paid in full by April 1st in order to nominate a judge.

Any horse NOT nominated by November 1, may be entered into the futurity by paying a LATE FEE OF \$500.00 by April 1st. All paid in full entries received by April 1st will be eligible to nominate a judge.

Rule # 4. All nominations shall include the completed entry form, the entry fee and a copy of the registration papers. The rules and entry forms are also available at our web site www.mofoxtrot.com/midamerica.

Rule # 5. All horses must be nominated by their registered MFTHBA name.

Rule # 6. All entry nominations, entry fees, and judges' ballots are to be sent to the following address:

Please make checks payable to MAFTHA. Please do not send cash in the mail. Be sure to mail all correspondence to the address above.

Rule # 7. No entry can be shown at halter after January 1, and remain eligible for the show.

Rule # 8. The entry fee will only be refunded upon receipt of a death certificate from a licensed veterinarian, provided the certificate is presented to the Futurity Treasurer within 30 days of death.

Rule # 9. No horse shall be shown in performance before the Futurity show date.

Rule # 10. Declaration as to the division (Open or Amateur) will be made at the futurity check in on the first day of the futurity horse show. A horse may not be shown in both Amateur and Open Divisions.

Rule # 11. Disruptive and/or Unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of show participants, owners, or spectators will not be tolerated and can result in disqualification from the show, forfeit of prizes and/or expulsion from the grounds.

Rule # 12. Once Mid America has been notified from our bank of insufficient funds from an entry after the entry deadline, the individual will have 5 business days to send the appropriate funds after being contacted by Mid America, with the additional bank fee included.

EXHIBITING

Rule # 13. Exhibitors must be 18 years or older to participate in the two yr old futurity or ride a two year old at the Mid America show.

Rule # 14. Amateur – Conforms to the rules of the MFTHBA description of Open Amateur.

Rule # 15. If a rider dismounts because of a fall or without permission he/she will be disqualified.

Rule # 16. Time-out will only be allowed if approved by the ring steward.

Rule # 17. The USDA/HPA rules will take precedence over Mid-America rules in case of conflict. Any entry who receives a ticket from the USDA or the DQP officials will be disqualified from the show and all prizes forfeited.

Rule # 20. An infraction of the rules must be protested in writing within 60 minutes of the offense by submitting a \$100.00 fee to a Mid America board member. Frivolous protests will not be considered.

Rule # 22. Any entry that is disqualified by a judge will be excused from the class.

JUDGES AND JUDGING

Rule # 23. All Futurity entries paid in full by April 1 are eligible to nominate a judge for the show. The top ten names will be determined and a ballot sent to all eligible Two Year Old Futurity entries who will select five judges. The final voting ballots will be mailed by May 1 and must be returned to the Futurity Treasurer postmarked by June 1. The judges will be determined by exhibitor ballot.

Rule # 24. Neither the judge nor members of their family shall exhibit or own a horse in the show.

Rule # 25. The judge will not be eligible to judge provided that he/she has trained, exhibited, conditioned, boarded, or owned any horse to be shown. If a judge cannot exercise an objective opinion, free from possible prejudice, bias, or outside influence, because of a connection with an owner, exhibitor or anyone else connected with the horse, or, for that matter, if such connection would appear to others of possible bias, whether or not the judge feels he or she would be affected, a judge must disqualify himself or herself, or may be disqualified by the MAFTHA Board of Directors. The judge must have a current MFTHBA judge's card and be in good standing with MAFTHA and MFTHBA.

Rule # 26. The judge shall not appear on the show grounds more that 15 minutes before the judging begins from the day the show begins until the conclusion of the final day of the show. Judges shall not visit with the exhibitors, owners, or handlers before the show, nor inspect or discuss any horse prior to class time. In the event this rule is violated, the judge will be dismissed and the alternate will judge. Judges shall not discuss horses or judging from the day the show begins until the conclusion of the final day of the show.

PAYBACK

Rule #27. Payback money will be split between the Divisions based on the number of entries per division on a percentage basis. 5% of the money received will be held for administrative and operational expenses of the Mid America Foxtrotting Horse Association.
